Several factors would be considered - your child's date of birth, current curriculum being followed, school reports, reference and work samples would determine which year group your child would be best suited. Teaching	g & Learning
What are the class sizes at DESS?	There are 20 places in FS1 and from FS2 to Year 6, there are 25-27per class.
How will I know what my child is learning in class?	You will receive a 'Learning@DESS' newsletter every fortnight to inform you of what your child has been learning, and what is coming up next. You are also welcome to join your child's Open Afternoon session each week, where you can share and celebrate your child's learning in their classroom. This takes place after school on a given day. In some lessons, we use a platform called Seesaw, so on occasions, you may have a window intowhat your child works on in class via the parent app. We also use Ladders at Home which gives you live access to your child's current targets, progress, and attainment.
	Children from FS2 to Year 6 have individual targets that the class teachers will share with you on a regular basis. Targets will also be discussed andshared in the bi-annual Parents' Evenings and in written reports. When logging into Ladders at Home, you can also see what broader objectives your child is working towards, or achieving, at any given time.

When do children start to learn Arabic?	Children begin to learn Arabic from FS2 at DESS. The number of lessons increases once the children enter Year 2 as the subject is compulsory from this point. We divide the children into Arabic A and Arabic B from Year 2. In FS2 they begin with learning vocabulary and visually what the letters look like. They begin with classroom commands, songs, counting and colours to prepare them for Year 1. All children are exposed to a variety of Arabic vocabularythrough play and the wider school environment. We are non-Arabic speakers; how can we best support our child?	Simply by engaging in what your child is learning; attending parent meetings, asking about their day and what they are learning, challenging them to use some of their Arabic learning in the real world.
When do children start to learn French?	At DESS, we offer French lessons for Years 4 to Year 6 for 50 minutes per week. From Term 2, the children in Year 3 begin their French lessons. Children also have the possibility to attend our popular French Club. For moreinformation, please click here.
How much homework can we expect?	Home learning tasks will vary depending on the Year Group. As a non-negotiable and where appropriate, children are expected to invest time in reading to an adult at home each evening and learning their weekly spellings (which are posted on Seesaw). Home learning tasks are recorded in your child's Home Learning Diary. Do you have a high turnover of staff?	We do not as we take care of our staff. Our staff love working at DESS. We have staff that have worked at DESS for over 20 years.

Physical Education & Swim Lesson	
Does my child have to change for PE?	All children will wear their PE kit to school and will wear it for the whole day if they have PE or a Sporting ECA.
If my child doesn't make teams / squads the first time around could they moved to the team later in the term/year?	The PE team are continually assessing the students during PE lessons and ECA. Students are moved around the teams at any point during the year. They will also be given areas to work on by the PE team to improve their skills.
Will my child be required to remove earrings for PE?	Earrings should either be removed or not worn to school on PE days. If ears are newly pierced and removing is an issue, the earlobes may be covered with microporous tape.
Do you offer Sport Scholarships?	At this point in time, no we don't. However, this may change in the future.

My child excels in a specific sport (e.g. swimming). How will you encourage this?	We have several squads that your child can try out for, as well as a variety of sporting ECAs.
My child is not the best at sport. Will they still be able to compete in matches or is that only for the top sports children?	We are proud to offer a variety of ability teams. Whereas most schools only offer A and B teams, we also offer C and D teams, and we seek opportunities with other schools where we can. Your child will also be assessed during this time so will have the opportunity to move up the teams.

When do we receive pupil reports?	Parents will receive the following Pupil Reports: • Mid-Year (End of Feb) • End of Year (Mid-June)
Which other Pupil Assessments are taken, and by which year groups?	 We use ongoing teacher assessments to track children's attainment and progress. CAT 4: This is compulsory for children from Years 4 - 6. GL progress tests (PT) are compulsory for children from Years3-6. Children take PT English, Maths and Science tests. The PASS (Pupil Attitudes to Self and School) test is taken byall children from Year 1 - 6.
Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs)	

Does DESS have an ECA programme?	(Please contact us for more information) Yes, we run a very comprehensive programme of ECAs ranging from Art & Crafts to Music and Sports to Photography. ECAs run before school 7:00 - 7:35, during the lunchtime snack break and After School 14:45 - 15:30.
How does the system work?	(Please contact us for more information) Essentially, your child makes the choice for each day. Once the sign up has closed the system randomly allocates places.

Can my Foundation Stage (FS) child take part in ECAs?	(Please contact us for more information) Children in FS have a limited number available. We find that FS children are tired after abusy day at school. When children move to Year 1 the available options increase greatly.
How often can my child select ECAs?	(Please contact us for more information) The programme runs on a termly cycle.
If my child joins DESS during the year, can they join ECAs?	(Please contact us for more information) Absolutely! Your child will be able to join ECAs at any point during the year. Chelhsea Cuddihy will be able to help you with this. Please email her at dessparentrelations@dessc.sch.ae
